# Written and Performance Exam General Overview

- The intent of this exam is to assess the candidate's ability to teach the skills found in the Massachusetts Technical Education Framework.
- The written exam is a state-developed exam aligned to the frameworks which can be accessed <u>here</u>. The performance exam is a NOCTI-developed teacher test and has been determined by DESE to align to the state frameworks.
- Many questions and tasks require a synthesis of knowledge based on experience in the field and may not be found in any book.
- Use this exam outline and the Massachusetts Technical Education Framework to focus your preparation for the exams.
- Candidates are encouraged to prepare for their written exam by reviewing textbooks and reference material which have been listed as part of this exam outline. These resources can be found using online search tools, online vendors, and websites.

# Written Exam Sample Items

Each question on the exam consists of one incomplete sentence or question followed by four choices. Some items reference an image or diagram. A few sample items are included below; the correct answer is designated with an asterisk (\*).

Balancing-Coil and Electronic are two types of:

- a. shutterstats.
- b. fuel gauges. (\*)
- c. fuel injectors.
- d. ignition coils.

An alternator full field test is used to:

- a. test the polarity of the alternator diodes.
- b. determine whether the fault is in the alternator or regulator. (\*)
- c. find an open in the stator.
- d. test the alternator capacitor.

# NOCTI Performance Exam

- Administration Time: 2 hours and 30 minutes
- NOCTI Criterion-Referenced Cut Score/Passing Score: 89.4%
- Administration Method: Onsite at a DESE approved Massachusetts Area Testing Center (MATC) location. Candidates must register and schedule their exam session through NOCTI.

# Performance Exam Content Coverage

#### **18%** *Cylinder Liner Installation* Participant will follow procedures for installation of a cylinder liner.

- **25% Perform a Wheel Bearing Adjustment and Brake Stroke Measurement** Participant will adjust wheel bearings according to Technical and Maintenance Council guidelines and apply brake stroke measurement.
- **15%** *Check and Adjust Rocker Lever Clearance* Participant will check and adjust rocker lever clearance in the engine provided.
- **11%** *Perform a Coolant System Inspection Participant will pressure test an engine cooling system and record findings.*

## 31% Electrical Testing

Participant will perform a battery discharge test, starter draw test, and alternator output test using the appropriate test meters.

# Performance Exam Requirements

# **Candidate Supplied**

Candidates must bring all appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), attire/uniform, and any other safety items (i.e., safety glasses) routinely expected to be used by an employee in the related industry. If the candidate does not bring what is needed to safely complete all jobs on the exam as required in the workplace, the testing session will need to be rescheduled at the candidate's expense.

# Site Supplied

Additional equipment and supplies needed to complete the jobs on the performance test will be provided by the testing site.

# Performance Exam Site Requirements

Testing sites may have individual requirements based on location and any relevant and current guidance from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).
